Renowned JFK Exhibition Makes its Only Michigan Stop in Saginaw at the Marshall M. Fredericks Sculpture Museum

Saginaw, Michigan—One of the most exhaustively researched collections of Kennedy photos ever assembled, "American Visionary: John F. Kennedy's Life and Times" brings together images from the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library, the John F. Kennedy Library Foundation, Getty Images, private collections, and the Kennedy family archives that capture public and private moments from Kennedy's life. Some of the photographs on display are iconic; others have never been seen publicly.

The exhibition is based on "JFK: A Vision for America" (2017), the award-winning book celebrating the history of Kennedy's historic life by Stephen Kennedy Smith and Douglas Brinkley, and the visual re-telling through Lawrence Schiller's unique photojournalistic perspective. The exhibition has traveled extensively around the United States, including to the Smithsonian American Art Museum, The New York Historical Society and Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum.
