Renowned Regional Artist-in-Residence to be Hosted by the Marshall M. Fredericks Sculpture Museum in Saginaw

ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE DATES: October 14-18, 2019

Saginaw, Mich. – The Marshall M. Fredericks Sculpture Museum will bring Michigan artist Kathyrose Pizzo to Saginaw Valley State University as an artist-in-residence October 14-18, 2019. The Museum envisions the artist-in-residence program as a way for 6th to 12th grade students, college and university students, and the public to interact with and learn from a working artist.

Classes and the public are invited to schedule a free visit during open studio hours throughout the artist-in-residence week at the museum. During open studio hours visitors and participants will have an opportunity to learn the process of making a plaster sculpture mold, work one-on-one with the artist to make a cast plaster sculpture with pre-made molds, and learn about her career as an artist. Sessions can be scheduled from one to three hours and have a limit of 20-25 students per session.

Pizzo will also give a free public lecture titled “Outdoor Sculpture and the Creative Process” on Wednesday, October 16 from 12:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. in the Museum.

Artist-in-residence Kathyrose Pizzo is a visual artist based in metro Detroit, whose practice is invested in sculpture. Pizzo completed her MFA in Art from Wayne State University and earned a BFA with a focus in painting from The School of the Art Institute of Chicago. Pizzo exhibits and lectures nationally. Her work has been featured in several museum and gallery exhibitions. She currently teaches in sculpture and other core areas of the art department at Wayne State University.
